



The 6th annual E3 Camp was made possible from a Public School Foundation, SKJAJA Fund and Outside Agency Grants (written by Anissa McLendon) and community donations. This Art and STEM Camp provided African-American middle/high school students - ranging from 6th to 11th grades - with educational field trips, hands-on activities and on site presenters. Students were exposed to 33 different career opportunities necessary to be future productive citizens in the 21st century workforce.

E3 Camp was held July 7th thru the 28th, 2023 at Chapel of the Cross in Chapel Hill.

Demographics: 28 students; 57% Girls (16) and 43% Boys (12); 75% Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools (21), 24% Alamance/Durham/Wake (6) and 1% Out of State (1).

Students were taught the parts of the 4 hour course of CPR/ AED and First Aid by certificated staff members of the Orange County Sheriff Department.












### - Dentistry -

Ken Mask taught the students how to play chess and the importance of each piece. Each camper were given a chess set to take home.




## Motivational Speakers
