2019 Camp Overview



The second annual E3 Camp was made possible by a Public School Foundation Grant (written by Anissa McLendon), partnership with Lee Moavenzadeh and Kamal Academy (an interfaith STEAM school in Chapel Hill), and community donations. This ART and STEM Camp provided students of color – ranging from 5th to 12 grades – with field trips, hands on activities and in class presenters. Campers were exposed to career opportunities necessary to be future productive citizens in the 21st century workforce.

This camp was held from July 14th thru August 2nd, 2019 at Glenwood Elementary School in Chapel Hill.

Demographics: 28 students, 93% African-American (26); 7% Latino (2); 64% Girls (18) and 36% Boys (10); 64 % Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools (18 students) and 36% Chatham/Durham Schools (10 students).

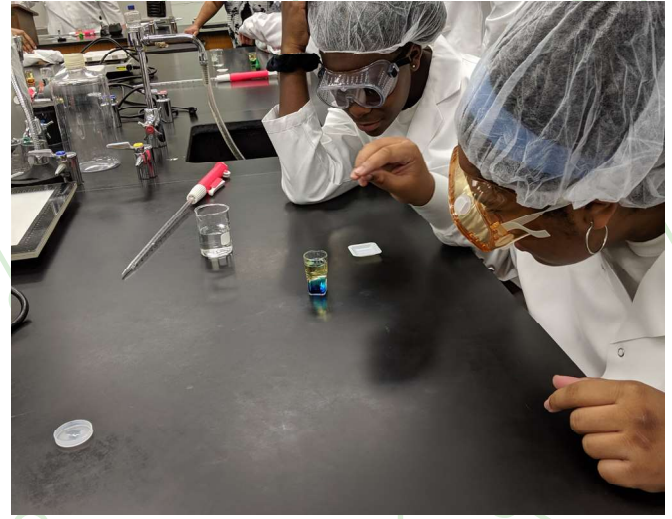
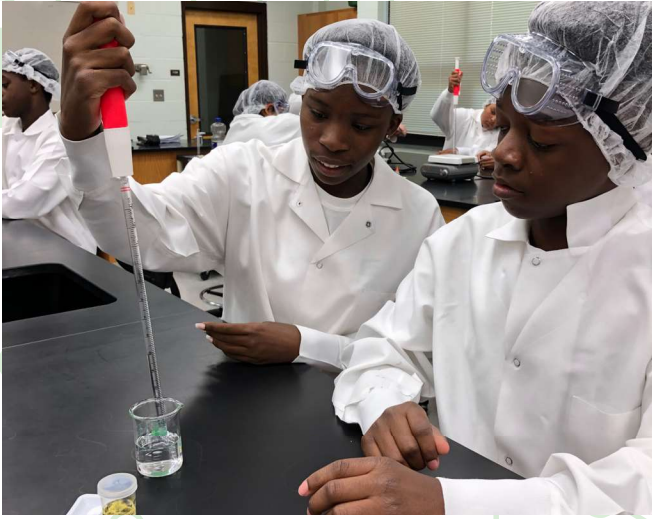
Empowering Thru Field Trips

The campers visited the Durham Life and Science Museum for an all day field trip. Students engaged in experiments inside and outside. Also they had fun on a train ride!



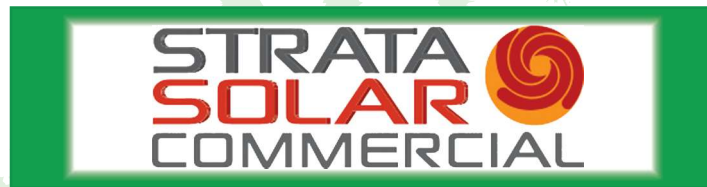

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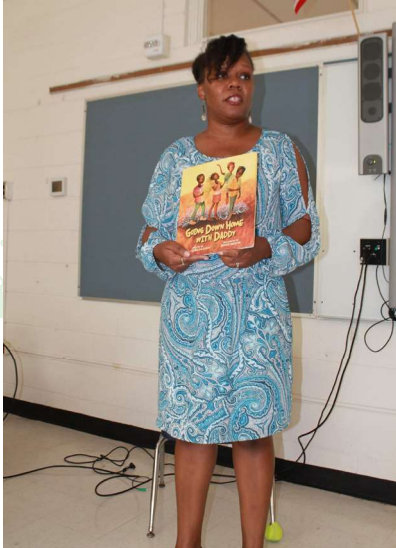

Retired CHCCS Librarian Dianne Jackson came and did a poetry instruction lesson.



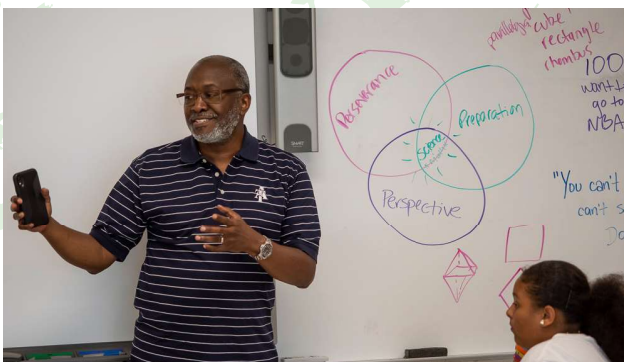
Compass Youth Center came and students were able to explore with coding programs.

Jeanne Cosmey from Biogen came and engaged students in 2 labs.

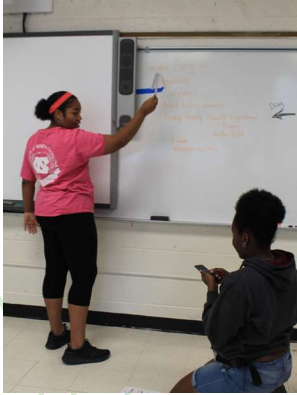


Willie Deese, camp supporter, speaking to students about goals and how to reach them.

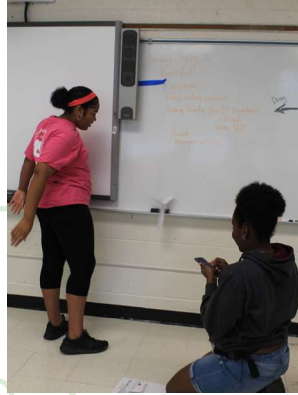
Not Pictured Presenters:

- Mrs. Randee Haven-O'Donnell, Durham Academy retired teacher, led the students in 3 water labs.

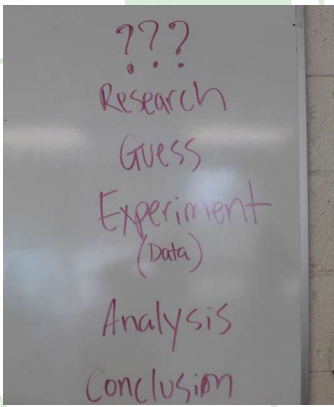
Activities
